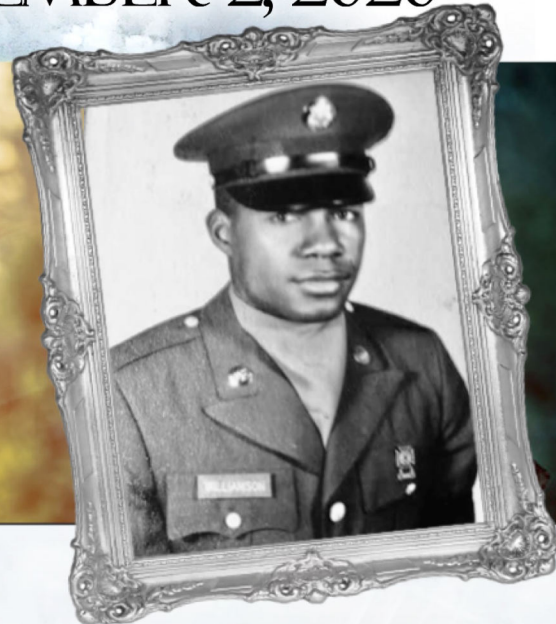

Deacon Mack "Sarge" D. Williamson, Sr. was born on September 13, 1940, in Franklinton, North Carolina, to the late Macon Williamson and Iola Brodie-Williamson. On December 2, 2020, he departed this life at Ocean Medical Center, in Brick, New Jersey.

Deacon Mack affectionately known as "Sarge" and "Pop Pop" attended and graduated from Freehold Borough Regional High School in 1961. He was known for his outstanding athletic ability and participated in track and field, gymnastics, and basketball.

On June 20, 1962, "Sarge" was joined in holy matrimony to Alberta B. Ethridge by the late Bishop Jesse Spivey and Elder Nora E. Spivey, in Trenton, New Jersey. Until his earthly transition, they were blessed and honored with 58 years of marriage. Their marriage was a true testimony of love.

In 1962, "Sarge" became an active member of Faith Tabernacle United Holiness Church of America Inc., Freehold, New Jersey; where he served as an ordained deacon, one of the church lead guitar players, financial secretary, and trustee under the pastorate of the late Elder Nora E. Spivey. Most notably, he played an intricate part in the prints and design for the churches' reconstruction project. He later became an active member of Lakewood Church of God, in Lakewood, New Jersey, under the pastorate of the late Pastor Henry Wilson. Prior to his earthly transition, Deacon Williamson attended and served at the Future Glory of Zion Church under the pastorate of Suffragan Bishop Louise Hagler. "Sarge" served the Lord with gladness and was a blessing to so many as he served in the Kingdom of God.

During his Christian walk, he was the guitar player and an original member of the Holy Echoes of Freehold, New Jersey, until his commitment was interrupted due to his sickness. He also was the editor and revised the original song "Get Back Satan." "Sarge's" love of music is known to many quartet groups both locally and abroad.

"Sarge" joined the New Jersey Army National Guard, 250th S & T, Freehold, New Jersey and retired after 28½ years of service, to which the words "Here, Let Me Show You" was adapted as a motto, created by him.

Through his dedication to his Christian life, he shared his Godly gifts with many by way of teaching, sowing guitar equipment into the lives of many, and using musical enhancements: yet his love for family was always his priority. As a protector and provider, in whatever he envisioned, he made it possible and a reality. "Sarge" was straight forward, but showed compassion to so many. Some of his favorite sayings were, "You take the Jonah Route, and I'll meet you in Nineveh" and "A Hard Head makes a Soft Behind"!

Along with his parents, "Sarge" was preceded in death by his brothers; Wille Edwards Williamson; James Williamson, and sister; Patricia Berry.

"Sarge" leaves to cherish his memory, his loving wife, Alberta B. Williamson; brother, George Williamson; sister, Mozel Daye; children, Anthony Blackwell, Sr. (Ina); Mack D. Williamson, Jr.; Victor Williamson (Victoria); Calvin Berry (Shanda); Samad Harvey; Nora Thompson; Julia Williamson; Dorothy Williamson; and Tenaya Williamson. His eight grandsons, Anthony Blackwell, Jr.; Tyron Blackwell; Jarred Taylor-Williamson; Jibril Thompson; Justin Simpson; Asion Williamson; Dylan Badu Mensah and Izaah Perez. His nine granddaughters, LaPhantae Lewis; Chantel Williamson; LaTasha Blackwell; LaTasia Blackwell; Asia Williamson; Chezaree Simpson; Jontice Berry; Serenity Berry and N'Tira Harvey. He was also favored to have sixteen great-grandchildren: a host of nieces, nephews, godchildren, family members, and friends throughout his 80 years of life and service. His life was a true model of a loving husband, father, grandfather, and friend.
