In 1976, David graduated with Honors from Atlantic City High School, where he received several academic awards and achievements. David chose to serve his country and enlisted in the United States Army from 1976


until 1982 along with several childhood friends. He served an additional two years in the Army Reserve. However, the bond with his friends would last a lifetime!

David Michael Bair worked in the casino industry (Bally's Grand & later Showboat) as a shift supervisor for many years. David spent the last 27 years employed by AtlantiCare Medical Center until he retired as an Anesthesia Technician in 2021.
