*"Mother" Alberta B. Williamson* was born on May 18, 1939, Wilson, North Carolina, and was the daughter of the late Warren and Clara Ethridge. On July 21, 2023, Mother Williamson departed this earthly life at the HMH Ocean University Medical Center, Brick, New Jersey and took her rest in the Lord. The Word of God declares in Revelation 14:13 NIV "Then I heard a voice from heaven say, "Write this: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on". "Yes", says the Spirit, "they will rest from their labor, for their deeds will follow them".

Known affectionately as "Mom" and "Grandma," Mother Williamson was a graduate of Wilson High School in Wilson, North Carolina. Her devotion to Christ throughout her early years was a testament to her growth and development of becoming a woman of grace, tenacity, and great will. Mother Alberta Williamson's life story is largely preserved in New Jersey, where she moved after growing up in the south. Her life became a testimony of the goodness and greatness of God's promises.

In service, "Mother Williamson" was a school bus driver for the transportation department at the Freehold Borough Regional High School for 25 years. Her commitment to the safety and well-being of students extended well beyond her duties. As an advocate for students, she held them accountable for their behavior and actions, but also nurtured and guided them. Commitment and dedication are hallmarks of her years of service to the Freehold Borough.

On June 21, 1962, "Mother Williamson" was joined in holy matrimony to the late Mack D. Williamson, Sr. by the late Bishop Jesse Spivey and Elder Nora E. Spivey, in Trenton, New Jersey. Until the transition of her husband, the late Deacon Mack D. Williamson, Sr., they were blessed and honored with 58 years of marriage. Their marriage was a true testimony of love. Together, they poured into the lives of many people and served their community well.

"Mother Williamson" accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior and was filled with the Holy Ghost at the young tender age of 9 years old. After moving from North Carolina, "Mother Williamson" became an active member of Faith Tabernacle United Holy Church of America Inc., Freehold, New Jersey; where she served as a missionary, youth advocate, choir director, lead singer, trustee, and an ordained deaconess under the pastorate of the late Elder Nora E. Spivey.



She later became an active member of Lakewood Church of God, in Lakewood, New Jersey, under the pastorate of the late Pastor Henry Wilson. Prior to her earthly transition, "Mother Williamson" attended and served at Future Glory of Zion Church, Lakewood, New Jersey, under the pastorate of Suffragan Bishop Louise Hagler. "Mother Williamson" served the Lord with great gladness and was a true blessing to so many people in and out of the Kingdom of God.

As a psalmist, she was known for flowing under the Anointing of God and would not stop until the power of the Holy Ghost took full control in her singing. Some of the greatest songs that she was known to sing was "One Day At A Time, Sweet Jesus", "I'm Willing To Do His Will", "This Morning When I Rose Yeah, I Didn't Have No Doubt", "Standfast, Standfast In The Liberty Wherewith Christ Has Made You Free", "Sweeping Through The City" and so many more. As a Missionary and Mother of Zion, she spoke and preached the Word of God and held fast to the standards of his Holy Word. She was known to never take down nor compromise her walk and relationship with Christ. One of her favorite sayings was "Holiness or Hell". She shared her Godly gifts with many by mothering and teaching, sowing into countless lives; yet her love for her family was always her main priority. She was very submissive to her husband and taught the values of marriage to so many couples.

"Mother Williamson" was preceded in death by her husband, Deacon Mack D. Williamson, Sr., her brothers, Grady, Warren, Leroy, Roosevelt, Otis, James, Pete, Jacob, Adolphus Ethridge and her sisters, Lucy Ethridge; Mary Peten. "Mother Williamson" leaves to cherish her memories, her sister, Annie D. Murray; Brother-In-Love, George Williamson; Sister-In-Love, Mozel Daye; children, Anthony Blackwell, Sr.; Mack D. Williamson, Jr.; Nora T. Thompson; Victor Williamson (Victoria); Julia Williamson; Dorothy Williamson; Calvin Berry (Shanda); Samad Harvey; Tenaya Williamson. Her nine grandsons, Anthony Blackwell, Jr.; Tyron Blackwell; Jarred Taylor-Williamson; Jibril Thompson; Justin Simpson; Asion Williamson, Dylan Badu Mensah, Izaah Perez and Chandler L. Jackson. She was also favored to have seventeen great-grandchildren: a host of nieces, nephews, godchildren, family members and friends throughout her 84 years of life and service.
